AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE VACATION OF A PORTION OF FIFTH STREET NORTH OF THE NORTH LINE OF HARRIS AVENUE AND SOUTH OF THE GOVERNMENT MEANDER LINE, AS SHOWN IN EXHIBIT A, ALL SITUATED WITHIN THE CITY OF BELLINGHAM; FINDING AND ADJUDGING THAT NO DAMAGE ACCRUE TO ANY PERSON OR PROPERTY BY REASON THEREOF, AND UTILITIES MOVED SHALL BE MOVED AT THE EXPENSE OF THE PETITIONER.

WHEREAS, the Technical Review Committee has considered the petition of The Port of Bellingham for the vacation of a portion of Fifth Street North of Harris Avenue,

WHEREAS, this Street Vacation shall provide for the public good by enhancing Marine Park WHEREAS, Fifth Street is not needed presently or in the future for public access (including vehicular, pedestrian, or visual),

WHEREAS, Fifth Street does not lead to a park, open space, view, natural area, or any other

natural or man-made attraction. The compensatory improvements to Marine Park shall

improve access to a park, open space, view, and a natural area,

WHEREAS, all the jurisdictional steps preliminary to the vacation have been taken as

provided by law,

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY OF BELLINGHAM DOES ORDAIN:

<u>Section 1.</u> That a portion of Fifth Street north of the north line of Harris Avenue and

south of the Government Meander Line, as shown in Exhibit A, is hereby vacated.

Section 2. That said vacation is not subject to reservation of rights to the City of

Bellingham for easements. Any utility to be moved shall be moved at the expense of the

petitioner.

Section 3. That no damage will result to any person or persons or to any property by

reason of the vacation of said property.

Section 4. That the Petitioner's fees have been waived for the vacation of the property

described in Section 1 as part of and in consideration of the improvements to Marine Park

within two years of the date of signature of this ordinance. The improvements shall consist

of a road (separate from the industrial parking area), sidewalk, street trees and landscaping,

drainage improvements, and a parking plan with a greater number of parking spaces for the

public. The cost of the Park improvements, exclusive of costs attributable to the industrial

area, shall be greater than the full amount of the appraised value of the vacated right of way.

Final Plans shall require the approval of the Park and Recreation Director consistent with the

requirements of this section.



Ordinance 1998-05-031, vacating 5th Street, provides for a waiver in funds provided the Port make certain improvements to Marine Park. Following is the status of those improvements.
